Large in Size

- 1) Need adequate room to move around
- 2) Need adequate room to standing in waste too much
- 3) Large body mass exposure to sun, cold, wind

"Prey Animal"

- Senses are tuned to avoid threats to their life
- 1) Easily clautrophobic
- 2) Wary of dark closed in spaces
- 3) "Run before thinking"

Process a lot of Food and Water

- 1) Drink 5-15 gallons of water per day minimum
- 2) Eat 5-30 pounds of food per day

Can be inquisitive and often leads to being destructive

- \blacksquare 1) "1000 pound two year olds"
- 2) Environment needs to be constructed keeping in mind that horses have 24 hours a day to look for trouble

How their environment can affect a horses health and well being

Weather

■ Exposure to excessive heat, cold, and/or wind can lower resistance to disease

Contaminated Water

 ■ Contaminated water can affect water consumption as well as increase exposure to disease

Wet, Adulterated Feed

 ■ Wet, contaminated, or soiled food can affect consumption and increase possibility of colic and disease

Injuries

■ Trauma and injuries can easily result from unsafe areas in environment

County requirements for an Equine environment

- □ 1) Secure fencing
- 2) Basic shade
- 3) Clean source of water

Components of a safe horse environment

Ground

- □ 1) Composition
- 2) Drainage
- 3) Elevation

Fence

- 🗉 1) Sturdy
- 2) Secure
- 3) Maintains eaasily
- 4) Can not easily injure
- Barbed wire
- Boards nailed on wrong side





Shelter

- 1) Size
- 2) Shelters against strong winds but is not too confining
- 3) Sturdy
- Galvinized panels without protection

Water

- 1) Adequate capacity
- 2) Out of direct sun
- 3) Sturdy
- 4) Easy to clean
- 5) Easy to repair

Feeder

- □ 1) Large enough capacity
- 2) Off Ground
- 3) Easy to keep debris and sand away from immediate surroundings
- 4) Will not accumulate moisture
